**Chapter 1: Vocabulary in Context**



**Context** = All of the words surrounding the \_\_\_\_\_ word that provide \_\_\_\_\_ to the word's meaning.

**Where are context clues?** Usually in the \_\_\_\_\_ sentence as the unfamiliar word. But, sometimes the clues are in the sentences \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_.

How using context clues will help you:

- You will save \_\_\_\_\_.
- By figuring out a word through context clues, you have a better chance of \_\_\_\_\_ that word.
- You will get a good idea of \_\_\_\_\_ that word is actually \_\_\_\_\_.

**5 Types of Context Clues:      IDEAS**

1. **I** \_\_\_\_\_ (General Sense of the Sentence or Passage) → When the context contains no examples, synonyms, or antonyms.
  - You have to do some \_\_\_\_\_ work. Look for other \_\_\_\_\_.
  - Ask yourself questions about the meaning of the \_\_\_\_\_.
  - What is the \_\_\_\_\_?
  - Is the word positive, negative, or \_\_\_\_\_?
  
2. **D** \_\_\_\_\_ → When a text provides the actual \_\_\_\_\_ of the unfamiliar word before or after it is introduced.
  - Common in \_\_\_\_\_.
  - Or, when the author \_\_\_\_\_ the reader won't know the meaning of the word.
  - Signal words:

  - Signal \_\_\_\_\_:
    - parentheses ()
    - set off by \_\_\_\_\_
    - dash --
    - \_\_\_\_\_ around the unfamiliar word ""
  
3. **E** \_\_\_\_\_ → something that is mentioned to help explain a point or to show that a general statement is true

- Often introduced with \_\_\_\_\_ words and phrases like:
  - for example, ...
  - \_\_\_\_\_, ...
  - including, ...
  - such as, ...

4. **A** \_\_\_\_\_ → a word or phrase that has the opposite meaning

- Sometimes have signal words:
  - however, ...
  - but, ...
  - \_\_\_\_\_, ...
  - on the other hand, ...
  - \_\_\_\_\_, ...
  - unlike, ...
  - as opposed to, ...
- Also helpful to look for a parallel structure to find antonym pairs.

5. **S** \_\_\_\_\_ → a word or phrase that has a similar meaning

- It may appear \_\_\_\_\_ in a sentence as a \_\_\_\_\_ of the meaning of the unknown word.
- Look for a \_\_\_\_\_ structure in a sentence to find synonym pairs.

**Vocabulary in College Textbooks:**

- Often provide \_\_\_\_\_ and one or more \_\_\_\_\_.
- Set off important words in *italic* or \_\_\_\_\_.
